



## EGYPT AND THE MEDITERRANEAN: CULTURAL CROSSROADS DURING THE FIRST MILLENNIUM BCE AND BEYOND

**B**ecause ancient Egypt was especially a center of attraction and dissemination for Mediterranean cultures during the first millennium BCE - when the spread of *Aegyptiaca* and the contribution of the Egyptian culture to the Mediterranean *koinè* became particularly evident - my own lines of research involve the interdisciplinary investigation of the dialog between Egypt and the Near East, and the Mediterranean world in this time period.

- 1) The relation between Egypt and other Mediterranean cultures
  - Egyptian iconography, religion and art in the Mediterranean world
  - Cataclysmic events involving Egypt and Palestine
- 2) Advanced technologies in support of the research (photogrammetry, laser scanner, remote sensing).
