Although there is no specific underlying theme, the papers all hone in to the topic of ancient Egypt's interconnections with its neighbors and all successfully throw new light on some aspect of that interconnection.

The papers are wide-ranging in subject, as may be seen by a glance at the Table of Contents for this issue, and the methodologies applied by the authors are almost as diverse as the material brought under study. This fact is encouraging in itself as the study of interconnections continues to evolve into a coherent and thoroughgoing branch of historical and archaeological knowledge despite the immensely broad base of its subject matter. We are sure you will enjoy these articles and find them profitable.

Our next fascicle, 6:3, will be another special issue – this one on the role of ceramics in the study of Egyptian interconnections. But papers on other topics may be submitted for the final fascicle of the year – our annual research reports and studies issue. Regular articles will fit equally well into that final issue, though short notes and research updates are also welcome. Manuscripts for fascicle 6:4, the reports issue, should be submitted by October 1, 2014.
