

TRIBUTE—CHARLES E. ARES

INTRODUCTION

In 1992 Professor Charles E. Ares retired from the University of Arizona College of Law—the very place he began his distinguished legal career over forty years earlier. In 1952 he received his J.D. from the University of Arizona College of Law and was admitted to the Arizona Bar in 1953. After law school, he clerked for Justice William O. Douglas and then went on to become a partner for the law firm of Udall & Udall in Tucson. He embarked on his teaching career at New York University where he taught as an Associate Professor from 1961–65 and as a Professor from 1965–66. Then, in 1966, he returned to his alma mater to become Dean of the College of Law. He served as Dean until 1973 and continued to teach at the law school as the J. Byron McCormick Professor of Law until his retirement in June. As a teacher of legal ethics, constitutional law and civil procedure, his instruction influenced several thousand students and lawyers.
