### MIRANDA AND MINOR OFFENSES ..... *Charles E. James, Jr.* 766

A recent decision by the Iowa supreme court has raised the issue of the applicability of *Miranda v. Arizona* to misdemeanors. The author suggests that decisions holding *Miranda* inapplicable to such offenses have reached the wrong result.

### A PRELIMINARY SURVEY OF THE ARIZONA FARM LABOR ACT ..... *Robert A. Kerry* 786

The Arizona legislature has recently enacted the Arizona Farm Labor Act. The author analyzes the mechanics of the Act and discusses several constitutional issues raised by its provisions.

### REGISTRATION EXEMPTIONS FOR SECURITIES ISSUED BY ELEEMOSYNARY ORGANIZATIONS ..... *Dwayne L. Burton* 811

Nonprofit organizations currently issue approximately one half billion dollars of unregistered securities each year. The author examines the distribution procedures, the efficacy of blue sky provisions for preventing unfair offers and recommends specific amendments to Arizona's securities registration exemption for eleemosynary organizations.

### CREDITORS' PREHEARING REMEDIES AND DUE PROCESS ..... *Andrew R. Sherwood* 834

Recent decisions of the United States Supreme Court have substantially reduced the prehearing remedies available to secured creditors in the event of default. The author examines the constitutionality of "self-help" repossession as set forth in state enactments of section 9-503 of the *Uniform Commercial Code*.

### PROFESSIONAL ORGANIZATION AND UNREALIZED RECEIVABLES ..... *Joan Seitz Pate* 853

Specific provisions of the *Internal Revenue Code* generally determine the tax consequences of investments into partnership and corporations. These provisions may be vulnerable when unrealized receivables are transferred. The author discusses various Code sections and judicial doctrines available as sources of attack, illustrating their unexpected tax results.
