Articles must be submitted as a print-ready PDF via e-mail to lymph@email.arizona.edu. All manuscripts must have been presented at the Congress either in poster or oral format.

In addition, in accordance to a motion passed by the General Assembly at the 15th International Congress of Lymphology, A COPY OF THE PROCEEDINGS MUST BE PRE-PAID IN ORDER FOR YOUR MANUSCRIPT(S) TO BE PUBLISHED.

Articles are accepted for publication on the condition that they are contributed to the 26th International Congress of Lymphology Proceedings only and that no substantial part has been published elsewhere. The general style of the manuscript should be in accordance with Lymphology and the Style Manual for Biological Journals, 2nd Ed., published by the American Institute of Biological Sciences, 2000 P Street, N.W., Washington, DC, USA, 20036.

Form and Style

3-page manuscripts (10 page maximum for multiple submissions by same author) should be submitted as an e-mail attachment (PDF print-ready format) and e-mailed to lymph@surgery.arizona.edu. E-mail, print mail address, and telephone and fax numbers also should be included in the text of the e-mail as well as in the attachment.

THE FIRST LINE OF THE MANUSCRIPT SHOULD PRESENT THE TITLE OF THE PAPER

The second line should contain the name of author(s), with first and middle initial. The third line should contain the name of the department and institution in which the work was done.

References:

References should be numbered consecutively as they appear in the text and names of up to three authors are requested after which "et al" is preferred.

Sample arrangement:

Footnotes:

Footnotes should be avoided. Please group footnotes together at the end of your

manuscript before the reference section or incorporate the information in the text material itself.

Abbreviations:

Standard abbreviations should be used consistently. Unusual or coined abbreviations should be spelled out the first time in the text with the abbreviation following in parenthesis.

TABLES AND ILLUSTRATIONS

Tables and illustrations should be embedded throughout the text, preferably being included on the same page where they are first discussed. They should have a selfcontained caption.

Tables:

Tables should be included in the text and numbered with *Arabic* (not Roman) numerals. A brief title should follow the table number. All unusual units of measurement, acronyms and abbreviations should be explained in a legend at the bottom of the table.

Photographs/line drawings:

Responsibility for obtaining prior permission in writing for reproduction of illustrations, or any other material, taken from published works is assumed by the author. A copy of the permission should accompany your manuscript. Black and white images (photographs, line drawings, graphs etc.) should be embedded in the text, preferably on the same page where they are first discussed.
