- Abbreviated curriculum vitae of the nominee (maximum 2 pages). The nominee should either still be in training or within 5 years of having completed training (PhD or medical residency or fellowship).

In addition, for the prize winners designated after peer review of the nomination packets, other assistance may be provided at the discretion of the 30th Organizing Committee. The ISL Presidential Prize winners will be honored during the Congress including at the Gala Banquet. All prize winners must attend the Congress and will be encouraged to submit a manuscript for peer-review publication in the journal *Lymphology*.
